



## **Welcome to Remote Learning for Teynham Church of England Primary School.**

During lockdown the school have moved to remote learning. The teachers have prepared a range of learning activities to challenge and motivate the children so that they continue to build on their existing learning and make progress while learning remotely at home.

We are using blended learning which is a mix of live learning, via Zoom, directed lessons, recorded lessons, activity sheets and creative ideas.

A rough guide to time spent learning is that KS1 (including EYFS) 3 hours of learning a day. For KS2 this is four hours of learning. Learning takes many forms. This could be a live lesson or completing a set task, reading, going for a walk and looking at the natural world, playing in the garden (physical exercise) or quiet time playing (wellbeing).

We are aware that some parents will be working from home and other parents will have additional responsibilities during lockdown and understand that home learning can be difficult at times. Whatever you can manage will be of benefit to your child.

There is an expectation that children will engage with learning and maintain contact with their class teacher throughout the week. This will be via Zoom meeting, emails or phone conversations. We want the children to share their learning experiences with their teacher and celebrate the week together.

Each week lessons will include English, Maths, Reading, (phonics and spelling), RE and Wellbeing as well as lessons for our wider curriculum, through topic based work.

Printed home learning packs are available so please do request these from you class teacher. These packs can be collected from school on Thursday and Friday between 9:00am and 3:00pm each week.

Please contact class teachers via their emails for any advice, sharing of work and just to keep in touch.

If your child has an EHCP and not in school Mrs McIntosh will be in frequent contact to talk about home learning and wellbeing. If your child is on the SEN register and you would like some extra support, please email their class teacher or call Mrs McIntosh.
