Dear Parents and Carers,

We are thrilled to be able to welcome you and your children back after so longit has been wonderful to see you all again.

Over the next 4 weeks we will be continuing with our Recovery Curriculum. This means we will be looking closely at gaps in the children's learning, particularly in phonics, reading, grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) and maths. To ensure our curriculum remains broad, the rest of subjects including science, music, humanities and art will be taught through our topic. Religious education and PE are taught separately.

Topic

As you will already know, our topic this term is World War 2 (WWII). So far we have explored some of the reasons for WWII starting and found out how vast numbers of children were evacuated. Over the coming weeks we will be finding out how food was rationed and the impact this had, as well as exploring some war time recipes. We will also explore the roles different people had in the war, focussing particularly on women.

P.E.

P.E. will continue to take place on a Monday morning. No earrings are allowed to be worn during P.E. lessons, therefore the children need to be able to take them out themselves, or have them taken out in the morning before school. Please make sure your child has their P.E. kit in school, as they will be unable to take part in lessons safely or comfortably without it.
