Reception and Key Stage 1

- Counting, how many stairs have you climbed? How many dogs can you see in a day?
- Go on a shape hunt when you are out and about. How many circles, rectangles, squares or triangles? Try to get your child to look for patterns.
- Build a tower with Lego/Duplo and look at colours and shapes
- Sing songs like - Five Little Ducks, Once I Caught a Fish Alive



Key Stage 2

- Bake a cake or biscuits with your child. Encourage them to



weigh and measure the ingredients

- Play board games like Monopoly and Yahtzee
- Try the Japanese art of paper folding - Origami - this is mathematical
- Go shopping and get them to pack the trolley or bag
