<u>Rabbit Class</u> January 2023

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to a new term at Teynham Primary School. We hope you have had a great Christmas and New Year and were able to have a restful break. We are very much looking forward to building on the successes of Terms 1&2 as we begin the year 2023!

<u>Topic – Misty Mountain, Winding River</u>

During Term 3, the focus will be on learning about rivers. Your child will explore the journey of a river and its features, learning specific vocabulary linked to rivers throughout the term. They will focus on the River Trent in particular and learn about the human and physical characteristics. In addition, they will learn about rivers around the world and the changing landscapes of various rivers and their uses.

In Term 4, your child will learn about mountains, both in the UK and around the world. They will learn about different types of mountains, learning subject specific vocabulary. In addition, they will learn about the water cycle and comparing habitats where mountains and rivers are present.

<u>English</u>

In English, your child will be reading the class novel 'This Morning I Met A Whale' by Michael Morpurgo and answering comprehension questions linked to this. Your child will consider the journeys of different rivers and write diary entries as somebody travelling down a river, focusing on descriptive writing and selecting the correct tenses. They will then use their knowledge of rivers to create information leaflets about them. When learning about grammar and punctuation, this term will focus on apostrophes, verbs, compound nouns, subordinating conjunctions and inverted commas. Your child will also have daily spelling/ phonics lessons and continue to work on the Nessy computer program at least twice a week.

Maths

In Maths, your child will be learning about multiplication and division with a focus on 2, 3, 4 and 5 times tables. In addition, they will learn how to multiply and divide by 2 digits as well as learning how to divide large number (such as 100) by 2, 5 and 10, using prior knowledge and new skills. They will solve some problems using these skills including learning scaling.

Your child will continue to learn their times tables and improve upon the speed of their recall– if you are unsure which times tables your child is currently learning, please speak to Miss Tapsell.

<u>Science</u>

In Science during term 3, in the States of Matter project, your child will identify and classify solids, liquids and gases. They will learn the properties of solids, liquids and gases and discover that some materials have properties of more than one state. They will learn that particles make up all matter and how their arrangement determines whether the material is a solid, liquid or gas. They will find that materials can change from one state to another and learn about how materials can change state. They will use thermometers to measure the temperature of water and observe what happens when water changes state. They will investigate melting ice and record their data on graphs. They will also learn about melting and boiling points, researching various materials' melting and boiling points.

In term 4, in the Grouping and Classifying project, your child will learn why we sort and group things and the important classification skills of observing and questioning. They will learn what

classification keys are and how they identify living things. Your child will learn the characteristics of the five vertebrate groups and the six main invertebrate groups. They will learn how to identify vascular and non-vascular plants and sort vascular plants into the three main groups. They will also examine and classify real plants and create a classification key based on their observations. They will learn about some newly discovered plants and animals and use a classification key to classify each discovery.

RE

In RE, your child will be learning about Christianity with a focus on the question: What is the Trinity? They will learn about Jesus' baptism and find out what Biblical texts say about the baptism and the Trinity. They will find out how Christians show their beliefs about the Trinity. They will also make links between biblical texts and beliefs about God.

In Term 4, your child will continue to learn about Christianity, this time with a focus on the question: Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'? Through studying the biblical texts surrounding Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, death and resurrection, your child will consider what these mean for Christians. They will learn how different Christian communities celebrate Easter and how Christians show their beliefs in worship.

<u>ICT</u>

In ICT lessons, your child will be learning how to safely use a search engine and how search engines work.

Reading and Home Learning

Your child will receive a staged reading book this term. This will be sent home on a Friday and needs to be returned to school on the following Wednesday. It is important that your child reads daily so that they are able to make as much progress as possible. Please fill their reading record in at home to show the reading your child has completed. Do let us know if they have enjoyed the book. We do also like hearing about any other books they have been reading at home. Maths homework will continue to be set via the MyMaths website on a Friday. Your child's login is stuck into their homework book.

Your child will also receive a new homework grid this term, linked to our new topic. Please choose one task to complete each week. Homework will be sent out on a Friday and needs to be returned the following Wednesday.

<u>P.E.</u>

This term, PE lessons will take place on Mondays and Thursdays. Please ensure that your child has a full PE kit (t shirt, shorts and plimsolls) in school on these days so that they can fully participate in the lessons. No earrings are allowed to be worn during P.E. lessons, therefore they need to be able to take them out themselves, or have them taken out in the morning before school.
